INTRODUCTORY RITES

We stand.

The People of God gather to celebrate Mass. We show the beginning of our sacred action by making the Sign of the Cross which shows we belong to the One God who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

We say together:

The Lord opened the gates of heaven, and rained down manna upon them to eat, and gave them bread from heaven: man ate the bread of angels

We make the Sign of the Cross

Priest + In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

People Amen.

Priest The Lord be with you.

People And with your Spirit.

The priest introduces the Mass and leads the Penitential Act.

Priest You were sent to heal the contrite of heart: Lord, have mercy.

People Lord, have mercy.

Priest You came to call sinners: Christ, have mercy.

People Christ, have mercy.

Priest You are seated at the right hand of the Father to intercede for us:

Lord, have mercy.

People Lord, have mercy.

Priest May almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting

life.

People Amen.

Priest Let us pray. O God, who have accomplished the work of human redemption through the Paschal Mystery of your Only Begotten Son, graciously grant that we, who confidently proclaim, under sacramental signs, the Death and Resurrection of Christ, may experience continued increase of your saving grace. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

People Amen.

LITURGY OF THE WORD



We sit. The People of God listen carefully to the readings from the Bible. We ask the Holy Spirit to open our hearts to God's message. We can decide on how we can live the message of these readings in our lives.

We sit for the readings of the Mass

We stand for the Gospel reading.

Priest The Lord be with you.

People And with your Spirit.

Priest + A reading from the holy gospel according to N.

People Glory to you, O Lord.

We listen attentively to the Gospel.

Priest The Gospel of the Lord.

People Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

We sit for the Homily.



We stand. After the Homily, we hear the Bidding Prayers

At the end of the Bidding Prayers, we honour Our Lady, as we all say together:

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST



We sit.

The People of God offer gifts of bread and wine which will become the Body and Blood of Christ.

The altar is prepared.

Priest Blessed are you, Lord God, of all creation, for through your goodness we have received the bread we offer you: fruit of the earth and work of human hands, it will become for us the bread of life.

People Blessed be God for ever.

Priest Blessed are you, Lord God, of all creation, for through your goodness we have received the wine we offer you: fruit of the vine and work of human hands, it will become our spiritual drink.

People Blessed be God for ever.

Priest Pray, brothers and sisters, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God the almighty Father.

People May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and the glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church.

Priest Celebrating the memorial of our salvation, we humbly beseech your mercy, O Lord, that this Sacrament of your loving kindness may be for us the sign of unity and the bond of charity. Through Christ our Lord.

People Amen.

Priest The Lord be with you. People And with your Spirit.

Priest Lift up your hearts. People We lift them up to the Lord.

Priest Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. People It is right and just.

Priest We thank you, God our Father. You made us to live for you and for each other.

We can see and speak to one another, and become friends, and share our joys and sorrows. And so, Father, we gladly thank you with everyone who believes in you; with the Saints and the Angels, we rejoice and praise you, saying:

We say together:

Holy, holy, holy Lord God of hosts. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

We kneel.

Priest Yes, Lord, you are holy; you are kind to us and to all. For this we thank you. We thank you above all for your Son, Jesus Christ. You sent him into this world because people

had turned away from you and no longer loved each other. He opened our eyes and hearts to understand that we are brothers and sisters and that you are Father of us all.

He now brings us together to one table and asks us to do what he did.

Father, we ask you to bless these gifts of bread and wine by the power of the Holy Spirit, and make them holy. Change them for us into the Body \maltese and Blood of Jesus Christ, your Son. On the night before he died for us, he had supper for the last time with his disciples. He took bread and gave thanks. He broke the bread and gave it to his friends, saying:

TAKE THIS, ALL OF YOU, AND EAT OF IT, FOR THIS IS MY BODY, WHICH WILL BE GIVEN FOR YOU.

Bells are rung. We bow to worship Jesus.

In the same way, he took the Chalice of wine, he gave thanks and handed the chalice to his disciples, saying:

TAKE THIS, ALL OF YOU, AND DRINK FROM IT,
FOR THIS IS THE CHALICE OF MY BLOOD,
THE BLOOD OF THE NEW AND ETERNAL COVENANT,
WHICH WILL BE POURED OUT FOR YOU AND FOR MANY
FOR THE FORGIVENESS OF SINS.
Then he said to them:
DO THIS IN MEMORY OF ME.
Bells are rung. We bow to worship Jesus.

Let us proclaim our faith:

We proclaim your Death, O Lord, and profess your Resurrection until you come again.

Priest God our Father, we remember with joy all that Jesus did to save us. In this holy sacrifice, which he gave as a gift to his Church, we remember his Death and Resurrection.

Father in heaven, accept us together with your beloved Son. He willingly died for us, but you raised him to life again.

We thank you and say: Glory to God in the highest.

Jesus now lives with you glory, but he is also here on earth, among us.

We thank you and say: Glory to God in the highest.

One day he will come in glory and in his kingdom there will be no more suffering, no more tears, no more sadness. We thank you and say: Glory to God in the highest.

Father in heaven, you have called us to receive the Body and Blood of Christ at his table and to be filled with the joy of the Holy Spirit. Through this meal give us strength to please you more and more.

Lord, our God, remember Francis our Pope, Bernard our Bishop, and all other Bishops. Help all who follow Jesus to work for peace and to bring happiness to others. Bring us at last together with Mary, the Mother of God, and all the Saints to live with you and to be one with Christ in heaven.

Through him, and with him, and in him, O God, almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, All glory and honour is yours, for ever and ever.

People Amen.

We stand.

Priest At the Saviour's command and formed by divine teaching, we dare to say:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed by thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

Priest Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil, graciously grant peace in our days, that, by the help of your mercy, we may be always free from sin and safe from all distress, as we wait in the blessed hope and the coming our Saviour, Jesus Christ.

People For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours now and for ever.

Priest Lord Jesus Christ, who said to your Apostles: Peace I leave you, my peace I give you; look not on our sins, but on the faith of your Church, and graciously grant her peace and unity in accordance with your will, who live and reign for ever and ever.

People Amen.

Priest The peace of the Lord be with you always.

People And with your Spirit.

We say together:

Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us. Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us. Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, grant us peace.

Priest Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.

All Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.

Spiritual Communion

My Jesus,

I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament.

I love You above all things,

and I desire to receive You into my soul.

Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally,

come at least spiritually into my heart.

I embrace You as if You were already there

and unite myself wholly to You.

Never permit me to be separated from You.

Amen.

We sit. During this time of silence, pray for God's blessing on your life, for your family and friends.

We stand.

Priest May sharing at the heavenly table sanctify us, Lord, we pray, so that through the Body and Blood of Christ the whole family of believers may be bound together. Through Christ our Lord.

People Amen.

CONCLUDING RITE

The People of God now receive a blessing. A blessing is an action which uses words and gestures to ask God to show his kindness to those being blessed.

The People of God are sent out as witnesses of God's presence and action in the world.

Priest The Lord be with you.

People And with your spirit.

Priest May almighty God bless you, the Father, and the Son, + and the Holy Spirit.

People Amen.

Priest Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord.

People Thanks be to God.

After Mass
